Amateur Radio Exams



A Visit from Riley!

The FCC's Riley Hollingsworth, K4ZDH was in Winston-Salem Thursday, March 6 to make a presentation at Wake Forest University and to receive a plaque from the Wake Forest Amateur Radio Club honoring him as Alumni Member #1. In addition to being the enforcement head of the Amateur Division of the FCC, Riley Hollingsworth is an alumnus of the Wake Forest University School of Law. He called Amateur Radio the only failsafe method of communication and called on all amateurs to be focused on bringing new hams into the service. About the future of Ham Radio, Mr. Hollingsworth called digital technology and the internet a great asset to Ham Radio. He particularly praised such innovations as internet linking of repeaters. While refusing to speculate on where the next big digital innovation may be, he said that digital voice communication is particularly exciting. On enforcement issues he said that the Amateur Service has the highest compliance rate of all the services.

Referring to the ARRL, Mr. Hollingsworth highly praised the new video produced by David Bell and narrated by Walter Cronkite. The new League President, Jim Haynie, W5JBP, and "The Big Project" to spread the enthusiasm of Amateur Radio to every school in the country were given very high marks.

He toured the FARC shack before the presentation and called W4NC "the nicest club station I've ever seen, . . . a particularly valuable asset with its location inside the Red Cross." He was so impressed that he has requested pictures of W4NC to show to others!
