FARC has a general membership meeting with a program on the 2nd Monday of every month at the Red Cross building, 690 Coliseum Drive in Winston-Salem. The club conducts its main business meeting (sometimes inaccurately and wrongly called the Board Meeting) on the 3rd Monday generally at the same location. This is where most of the club's business is conducted and all attending members have a vote. All clubs members are strongly encouraged to attend the business meeting. Mr. Charles P. Everest Jr., 81, of Winston-Salem died Thursday, May 22, 2003, at Forsyth Medical Center. Mr. Everest was born Aug. 20, 1921, in Manchester, N.H., to Charles P. Everest Sr. and Marjorie Bunnell Everest. Prior to living in Winston-Salem, he was an avid golfer, played pro golf, and was an avid horseback rider. In Southern Pines, he was half owner of Mile-Away Stables. In 1951 he moved to Winston-Salem to work in purchasing at Western Electric and worked there until taking early retirement in 1976 due to his health. He was a member of Parkway Presbyterian Church, where he was active as long as his health permitted. He was an avid baseball fan, was announcer for the Winston-Salem Red Sox at Ernie Shore Field, and was active in Little League baseball. He was umpiring chief for the Northwest Little League for a number of years and then was a team manager. He was very active in amateur radio and was one of the first to know of the invasion of Grenada. Preceding him in death were his parents and a sister. He is survived by his wife, Edith Carter Everest of the home and many other family members including several special in-laws, whom he was very loving and supportive of. A private memorial service will be held. There will be no visitation at the funeral home. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to a charity of the donor's choice. Vogler & Sons Reynolda Road Chapel is serving the family.
