The club conducts its main business meeting (sometimes called the Board Meeting) on the 3rd Monday generally at the same location. Short Circuits

Blue Ridge Parkway Radio event September 16th and 17th

At our June Meeting we hosted visitors from the Roanoke Valley Amateur Radio Club, Ray, AB4YZ, and Fred, K4HVB. Ray and Fred discussed the upcoming Blue Ridge Parkway event on September 16th and 17th, from 9AM to 5 PM both days. There will be 17 stations on the air on 40m at selected points along the Blue Ridge Parkway between mileposts 0 and 455.7. Eleven of those stations will be in VA, and the remaining 6 will be in NC. Participants are instructed to operate from their vehicles, as portable set-ups on Parkway property will not be allowed.

The plans are to have single vehicle radio stations at the following locations during the weekend:

Rockfish Gap, Natural Bridge, Apple Orchard Mt, Peaks of Otter, Explorer Park, Devils Backbone, Rocky Knob/Mabry Mill, Groundhog Mt, Fancy Gap, Blue Ridge Music Center, Cumberland Knob, Lynnville Falls, Mt. Pisgah, Cherokee.

W4NC has volunteered to man the Cumberland Knob site and the Linville Falls site. RVARC will be designing a special event QSL card for the event. A special certificate will be awarded for all 17 stations worked. Stations will maintain paper logs to be turned in to RVARC following the event. Contact Henry, W2DZO if you are interested in manning one of the stations.
