NC QSO Party

Results of the 2007 North Carolina QSO Party

The 2007 version of the NCQP offered all sorts of weather in the state of North Carolina - rain and sleet in the NW mountains, rain on the coast, and a clear cool day in the piedmont and sandhills. Still,

nothing stopped the dozen or so mobile operators and the other 100 or so ops from making our annual event one of the best ever. In fact, we received about 120 logs, the most we have ever received since the FARC began its sponsorship of the Party in 2000.

While most seem to be pleased with the goals and rules of the NCQP, there have been some inquiries about multi operator capabilities. We will take a look at all the comments and invite all to comment. The biggest issue we see is groups interested in multi-op operation. Our current rules allow multi op with only one transmitted signal at a time- and no band change limits. Several groups have expressed interest in a multi 2 operation, allowing 2 signals at the same time. Existing categories will mostly likely not be affected if we make any changes, and we'll publish any changes well before the next NCQP.

The club conducts its main business meeting (sometimes called the Board Meeting) on the 3rd Monday generally at the same location. This is where most of the club's business is conducted and all attending members have a vote. All club members are strongly encouraged to attend the business meeting. SINGLE OPERATOR

The single operator instate category features a repeat win by Russ AK4GY from Cabarrus county with Barry K4CZ with only 30 less q's from Durham county placing second. Tim K4TZZ picks up 3rd place and the instate mult title with 46 NC counties worked from Polk county.

Out of state it was Jeff N8II from WV edging out perennial QSO party stalwart Keith WA3HAE by 1 mult and 27 qsos. Jeff also took top NC mult honors. Third place was last years' top finisher John K4BAI from GA. The single operator out of state category continues to have the highest amount of activity.

QRP instate was a well deserved effort by Roy WA4DOU. His reputation preceded him, and no one else opted to participate in the category. I look for more players in this one next year.

The QRP out of state winner is another repeat performance by Paul W8TM from OH with Dan KE0G from MN coming in 2nd and Robert N3HU grabbing 3rd place from MD. Paul's 55 NC multipliers with 5 watts was a tremendous effort!

Ben K4GHS from Yadkin County picked up the FARC club prize in the SO column.

CLUB CATEGORY

The Carolina DX Association once again grabs the instate Club plaque for their 450 plus contacts from MEC with the BFB boys running 2nd place. Out of state it was the Cornerstone ARC from Florida winning the plaque again! Note to out of state clubs- I challenge you to try this category- Cornerstone is running out of room on their wall!!

MOBILE

This year's in state mobile competition was the closest, percentage wise, in recent years. Last year's winner Jeff NY4N and NCQP newcomer Marty W4MY both made over 500 contacts, but when the dust settled (and the log checking) only around 500 points separated the two. Jeff made more q's but Marty won the mult count and thus W4MY has been crowned the winner. We are awarding a second place plaque to Jeff because his effort was outstanding! Read the soapbox and you'll see how many people remarked on these 2 operations. Marty and Jeff really made our 2007 special (not to mention Ron AA4S who also made over 500 q's in the FARC from his mobile station to win the FARC competition.)

A lesson in making sure you're prepared beforehand. I never altered my multiplier file in my program for the right 3 letter abbreviations. Also, I logged my first 20 contacts with the wrong combination and was handing out DAV instead of DVD. Except for some mic and tuner issues, things went well for something that was setup a week ago and untested. - Ed KU4BP

This was my first attempt at operating the NCQP mobile, and I brought a couple of

friends (Dick - N4ARO and Julius - N2WN) who have lots of experience with fixed-station contesting, but who had not had the mobile experience. I would love to be able to keep it short like Julius Caesar and say, "Veni, vidi, vici!", but it didn't work out that way. We started the contest at the NC/TN state line between Asheville and Johnson City (TN), and immediately suffered every kind of equipment dysfunction imaginable. The Hustler tuned to 40-m CW wasn't getting out (or else the mountains were sucking up all the RF); inverters providing AC power to the PCs running our logging/operating programs suddenly decided to add killer hash to the received signals; and a controller driving the wiper to one of our tunable Hi-Q antennas flaked out. We had planned to drive up the Blue Ridge Parkway, but it was rainy and quite foggy up there, and I missed the on-ramp. We never even got on the Blue Ridge. Over 2 hours had passed in the contest by that time, and we only had 20-something QSOs; so we decided to head south out of the mountains and see if there was better propagation in the flats. Sho'nuff, we finally got cranking and logged 327 QSOs on 40 and 80 CW to add to the 4 we got earlier on 20 m. We called it quits and logged our last QSO a little early at 0128 Z. Short Circuits

Field Day

An idea has been put forward to do Field Day slightly differently this year. We will still be at Hobby Park. We will still be putting up all the antennas like before. The rules are being reviewed to see what that entails - but the biggest issue is that the generator would stay at the Red Cross. Part of the idea is to also use paper logs (no computers) and check sheets like the (not-so) good old days. Raja, KB6MTH, and Don, WS4NC, have agreed to loan their FT-817's for the weekend. The Club's FT-920 can be turned down to 5 Watts. It would make set-up and take down somewhat easier and would more closely simulate a real emergency, which is part of what Field Day is about. Your thoughts will be solicited at the May Club meeting.

We would need to change the oil in the generator, since field day is our annual generator tune up. We may also purchase some solar panels to recharge the batteries. We believe that we can get some big, new 12-volt batteries donated.
